Dear Friend,

IHN is known in our community for its emergency shelter program because of the amazing number of volunteers who help provide hospitality to homeless families every year. But I'd also like IHN to be known for so much more. When I speak with individuals and groups about the many facets of IHN, it's almost like I can see a light bulb go off at the moment when they "get it." Because that's when it all makes sense – that IHN provides services to a family whether they're homeless or when they have a home but are still in need. Offering holistic services means that a family has a safety net allowing them to continue working with IHN until they are completely self-sufficient.

The relationships that families forge with IHN over time mean that parents aren't passed from one agency to the next. They have a place to come for help where they are known and where they don't have to retell their story a dozen times before they get the assistance they need. That kind of service model not only makes good sense, but it's also a humane way to help lift families out of the hopelessness of poverty.

During 2013 – an exciting year of transition – IHN continued to provide emergency shelter through our congregational network. We were also the proud recipient of the Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-housing Program Grant. As the only agency in Essex County to receive this grant from HUD, IHN was able to help prevent families from becoming homeless and to help those already homeless with rental assistance. Based on the premise that it costs more for society to provide emergency shelter than resources for housing, I believe this grant was a responsible and worthwhile way to address poverty and homelessness.

We are acutely aware that IHN would not exist were it not for generous friends like you who participate with their wallets, their time, and their hearts to help ensure families in our community have a safe place to lay their heads. Thank you for not looking the other way, but instead finding a way to change lives for the better.



The Congregational Shelter Program

Homelessness – it usually stems from job loss, a natural disaster, family tragedy, childhood trauma, or illness – something that puts an already fragile family over the edge. These families come to us in crisis mode, needing to find a solution, at least temporarily, while they try to find a permanent home. Over and over this scenario plays out in a county that has the distinction of having the second highest rate of family homelessness in New Jersey.

For 26 years now, IHN has provided homeless families with emergency shelter through its unique model of utilizing congregational space and their volunteers. Opening their church or temple for a week at a time, volunteers set up makeshift bedrooms for our families, cook meals, play with the kids, and lend a listening ear to whoever needs it. This compassionate response not only can help change the

lives of our families for the better, but can also change the lives of volunteers. One such moment played out when a Board member and volunteer, Kathy Stine, caught on video the first steps of baby Sinay. Being able to provide the video to Chantenay, the mother, as a keepsake is something that does not happen in your ordinary shelter. But it happens at IHN.

While families are in the shelter program, they receive case management services to help put them on the right path toward permanent housing. We assist them with

housing and employment searches; childcare; referrals to appropriate resources; credit repair; savings strategies; educational opportunities; and more.

On The Road To Stability

Naomi and her sons were in our congregational shelter program for over three months. During the summer of 2013, they were able to move to a new apartment that they could afford in the same district where her son Alturique was already going to school. 3-year-old Malachi was able to be enrolled in preschool while Naomi set her sights on furthering her education. Truth be told, we all missed seeing Malachi play in the Family Resource Center, but we're happy to see the family progressing so well.

Through the IHN Home for Good program, we will continue to guide Naomi as needed -- until she and her family are self-sufficient.



A permanent HOME

- 140 individuals received assistance after moving to their permanent homes
- 55 children received camp scholarships
- 21 adults attended workshops
- 50 families received Thanksgiving baskets
- 60 families received help with Holiday gifts

The Home For Good Program

We want to make sure that families who move into permanent housing never become homeless again. But for those living in poverty, life is often full of complications and the road to self-sufficiency can be long. Parents face uncertainties relating to job security, safe housing, transportation and unexpected events.

The IHN Home for Good program provides moms and dads with a safety net when difficulties arise. They can continue to work with their case manager to access needed resources such as help with groceries, utility bills, childcare, continuing education and workshops, and camp scholarships. Having this program in place helps parents make progress towards long-term success for themselves and their children.

25 children attended the Afterschool Program and benefited from:

- Homework assistance
- Tutoring
- Fun Friday activities such as yoga, clowning demonstration, art projects, dental clinic, financial workshop
- Holiday celebrations for birthdays, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day, Halloween, Christmas

The Afterschool Program

Children who are or have been in the Congregational Shelter Program are eligible to join the IHN Afterschool Program. Typically, 10 to 15 children meet at our Family Resource Center in Montclair where the children spend the afternoon doing their homework and receiving tutoring when needed. On Fridays, children participate in

a fun activity, whether it be yoga, a birthday celebration, a museum visit or an art session.

The Afterschool Program not only helps children who suffered academic setbacks from the trauma of homelessness but it also limits the cost of aftercare for working parents. We are grateful for volunteers from the Seton Hall D.O.V.E. program, Montclair High School, Montclair State University and the community at large who make the children feel welcome and safe while sharing their talents.




